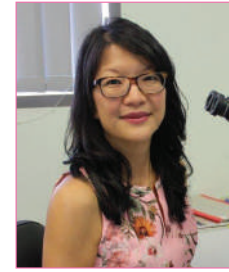
Our Pathologists



Professor Colin Stewart

Professor Colin Stewart is an expert gynaecological histopathologist who has worked with gynaecological research groups both nationally and internationally. He is also currently a consultant pathologist at King Edward Memorial Hospital and a Clinical Professor at the University of Western Australia who has published more than 200 peer reviewed articles. His advisory roles include member of the Expert Panel Royal College of Pathologists Australasia (RCPA) for Reporting Datasets in Gynaecological Malignancies, co-author for RCPA Datasets for Endometrial Carcinoma and Vulvar Carcinoma and RANZCOG (clinical Practice Guidelines on the Intraoperative Assessment of Endometrial Carcinoma). He is also a pathology reviewer for the Australian national studies on ovarian (AOCS) and endometrial (ANECS) carcinomas, contributor to the WHO classification of tumours of the Female Genital Tract and a member of the International Collaboraton on Cancer Reporting (ICCR) committee for reporting of carcinomas of the ovary, fallopian tube and peritoneum, and cervix.

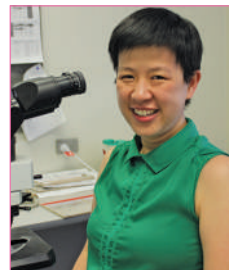
